### **Earthquake: Mission Trip Cancelled**

With great sadness and compassion, our hearts swelled with the desire to help our brothers and sisters in Haiti. Unable to go on our scheduled mission trip, God directed Brother Maury and Sister Kimmie to transport a large truck of donations to Tennessee to a cargo container headed to the Poor Children's Assistance Project in Haiti. Pastor Tim's cousin, Laurie, rallied York Suburban High School students to donate school supplies. Catherine, a dear friend of the ministry families, began making one hundred totes for the Haitian women to carry their families' rice and beans. When Pastor Tim saw her labor of love, he voiced that he would love to have a thousand totes to send to Haiti. Catherine took Pastor Tim's challenge as she rallied local sewing bees to help her accomplish this monumental task which produced over

1,000 totes. Church/community members collected: small toys, beanie babies, children's sandals, women's scarves, tarps, and clothes. We greatly admire our Haitian brothers' and sisters' resilience and endurance, as they labor by hand in the long rebuilding process. We are challenged by their determination to reconstruct their churches and schools.

### **New Beginning Curriculum**

For numerous years, we have interceded for orphans of various orphanages in Haiti. We are excited for the orphans released in January through Humanitarian Parole; however, we quickly realized the difficult transition ahead of them due to cultural differences. Pastor Rob and Dr. Peg, with the help of our Haitian Pastor Charles Bazille, compiled a transitional New Beginnings Curriculum for the purpose of encouraging the adoptive parents to use picture cards with both languages; enabling both child and parent to cross the cultural bridge. Currently there is no ESL Haitian Creole Curriculum in print; thus, the language barrier was a huge obstacle. Please continue to pray for these children and their new families as they face many challenges in regards to adoption in a foreign land.
